
Easter Community Day

As members of the Christ the King Sixth Forms family we ask for your continued blessing upon our work and study. You are the source of all truth and wisdom.


May we experience in full the Life that you offer us each day, to become the best that we can be.

BT Elevate Event Upskills CTK students!

The 8th session of this year's BT Elevate programme saw several CTK students benefit from essential skills in preparation for the world of work. At a time where students' education and ability to engage with employers has been severely impacted due to the Covid -19 pandemic, this has been a fantastic opportunity for many of our students.





The 8th session held online was theme 'Careers & Interview Skills Workshop.' The fully packed session started with Tom Culley -the Programme Lead at CTK taking the audience through a reflection of the journey students on the programme had made this year, with the first session focused on Growth Mindset and Resilience.

Students had the fantastic opportunity to meet Ashley Fongo of the band Rak-Su, who gained national recognition when they won The X Factor in 2017. In this memorable session, Ashley shared his experience of how he and his band were successful by being resilient and having a growth mindset. Since then, the BT Elevate programmme has had seven other sessions geared at developing work-related soft skills that are essential ingredients to be successful.





The last session allowed students to reflect and think about how they can utilize and apply the hard and soft skills they had learned over the year. Trevor Gomes, the BT Elevate programme leader at the end, gave his 'Top Tips' habits for success and the programs closed with a thank you message to all the participants, guest speakers over the year, mentors and students.

Invest Africa's CEO talks with CTK



We were also delighted that students were able to join a talk by Veronica Bolton-Smith, who spoke about her career journey after studying Politics and International Relations at the University of Hull.

After graduating, she returned to London to work as a House of Commons Researcher. She worked for John Bercow, who, at that time, was Shadow Minister for International Development and later went on to become the Speaker of the House. She progressed to working as a Researcher in the House of Lords, then decided to move to the Civil Service, where she joined the Department for

International Development (DFID), specialising in aid, development, and trade projects in Africa. Whilst this was great experience, Veronica became frustrated with the slow pace at which projects moved once a decision had been made about funding, so she took the opportunity to move into the private sector to a not-for-profit organisation set up by Baroness Chalker. Veronica continues to work on projects in Africa and has travelled to Togo and Angola, as well as Mauritius, bringing together UK investors, particularly asset managers, with opportunities to set up businesses with local partners, focusing on longer-term trade, rather than short-term aid. It was an inspiring talk with some valuable messages about not being afraid to break away from the crowd, being brave enough to try something new, but also, in your career decisions, remaining true to your core values and principles.
