
Chaplaincy Thought

Femi Bola MBE

We were delighted that as part of Black History Month we had Femi Bola M.B.E. speak to our science students. Femi was in her own words 'the first black scientist to work for the Medical Research Council in the United Kingdom.' Femi spoke to students about her studies and career as a biochemist with the Medical Research Council and running a laboratory, which undertook vital research for Great Ormond Street Children's Hospital.

Femi passed on lots of useful advice about finding work experience, wider learning, how to research university choices, and extracurricular activities. We are always delighted to have speakers such as Femi join us to advise and inspire our students as well as to help us celebrate Black History Month

Students from CTK St Marys have been taking part in a broad range of Enrichment Activities this half term. These opportunities provide a chance to meet new people, try something new or learn new skills. External Speaker Programme

Our annual External Speaker Programme got off to a flying start with John Kerr, former MD of Global Consulting, Deloitte, speaking to our Business students.

John explained to students his role as the Managing Director of Global Consulting at Deloitte which is a \$10bn, 45,000 person practice, and the largest Consulting practice in the world. It forms part of the even bigger \$32bn, 200,000 person worldwide firm, Deloitte. In his leadership roles, John explained to students how he had visited over 30 countries around the world and he has met executives who operate in most of those countries. Of interest, he was in New York on 9/11, London on 7/7, Paris on the day of the Concorde crash and experienced an earthquake in Taiwan.



Unloc Leaders Event with Local Schools

We were delighted to hold our annual Student Leadership Training with local schools in partnership with award winning organisation Unloc. The event supported local student leaders in understanding their roles and how they can make the most impact. Students were represented from many local schools including; Bonus Pastor, Addey & Stanhope School, Trinity Church of England School, Prendergast Ladywell School, St Mary's Catholic High School Croydon, Saint Gabriel's and Ark Greenwich Free School.





John was born and raised in Motherwell, Scotland. He attended a comprehensive school and was the first member of his family to go on to university. He is a Chartered Accountant and has spent his entire working career in two firms, Arthur Andersen, where he became a member of the global board, and Deloitte. John explained how the biggest challenge of his career was a member of the Andersen board when it faced the Enron crisis, which led to the winding up of the firm.
